In the latter case, the Member may only participate on the same basis as a member of the public and cannot participate in any discussion of, or vote taken on, the matter and must withdraw from the meeting in accordance with the Council's procedure rules.

Comments: Walmer Town Council have been informed that there are several issues with the location that need to be checked by DDC.

- Charging of electric carts has been done overnight in an unmanned building, this building also contains an amount of flammable liquid that could cause harm. WTC also believes that both the Health and Safety Executive and Kent Fire and Rescue Service should be informed.
- 2. Parking in the area has continued to grow due to the golf and kart track and councillors have been informed by residents of parking difficulties for both residents and local businesses especially during the summer.
- 3. The cart track has been relaid using four inches of tarmac over an already existing surface, the rest of the golf course has also had a substantial amount of topsoil removed and replaced with hardcore. The contract indicates that if the business was to leave due to collapse before the end of the contracted time, it would need to be returned to its previous state. It is not believed this would be possible with the current state of the location.
- 4. WTC believe that the issues with this location should be looked into by Planning Enforcement as soon as possible for both these and other already known problems.

Item: Report on replacement for projector at No 8 The Strand

Date: 8th Feb 2024

Meeting: Planning Committee From: Administration Officer

Due to irreparable mechanical issues with the projector at No 8 The Strand, there is a need for a replacement. This is primarily for use by the Planning Committee but also for other committees and working groups that may require the projection of a video or documents. There are a few options for the replacement of the projector for the council.

The first option is to replace the original ceiling mounted Epson projector with one with similar function, the original projector was bought at the cost of £354.00 when bought in 2013. This projector has been discontinued and a replacement will need to be sourced, a similar projector according to the Epson website will cost £450 or higher. This would also require the staff to mount it in place of the earlier projector, it is also possible that brackets will need to be obtained if the original is not suitable.

Checking on the Epson website brought up the Epson CO-W01 at £449.00 (Inc VAT) or at Amazon for £368.99, this projector has most of the same capabilities as the original with some improvements. This does not include insurance for damage or failure.

The second is to source a smaller, possibly desk-mounted projector for short-term use, this would have the advantage of being far cheaper and simple to use and would not require mounting on the ceiling. These can be sourced from other locations such as Amazon for desk mounted from approximately £60 onwards.

The greatest issue with these cheaper projectors is that they can fail within a short amount of time, although only used occasionally outside of the once-a-month meeting for the Planning Committee.

The third is to continue to use the council owned television that is currently in place at No 8, this screen is smaller but visible and is sufficient to display directly from a laptop. This will not require any costs outside of the standard electricity supply that is used, an amount that is likely to be less than either of the other choices.

Use of the television also means less likelihood of failure than the mini projectors, as well as the ability to move it when and where necessary for meetings. The television is also already owned by the council and so will cost nothing in outlay.

It is also necessary to mention that the purchase of a projector may depend on the council's position considering No 8 The Strand in the future, if it is no longer use by the council as a

meeting place then any projector bought for the short term may be put into storage for the foreseeable future. This is also likely if the Planning Committee returns to Elizabeth House for meetings due to the projector already in position there.




