withdraw from the meeting at the commencement of the consideration of any matter in which they have declared an OSI and must not participate in any discussion of, or vote taken on, the matter unless they have been granted a dispensation to do so or the meeting is one at which members of the public are permitted to speak for the purpose of making representations, answering questions, or giving evidence relating to the matter. In the latter case, the Member may only participate on the same basis as a member of the public and cannot participate in any discussion of, or vote taken on, the matter and must withdraw from the meeting in accordance with the Council's procedure rules.

Item: Report on replacement for projector at No 8 The Strand

Date: 22th Feb 2024

Meeting: **Planning Committee** From: **Administration Officer**

Due to irreparable mechanical issues with the projector at No 8 The Strand, there is a need for a replacement. This is primarily for use by the Planning Committee but also for other committees and working groups that may require the projection of a video or documents. There are a few options for the replacement of the projector for the council.

The first option is to replace the original ceiling mounted Epson projector with one with similar function, the original projector was bought at the cost of £354.00 when bought in 2013. This projector has been discontinued and a replacement will need to be sourced, similar projectors have been found at a cost of between £270-£350. This would also require the staff to mount it in place of the earlier projector, it is also possible that brackets will need to be obtained if the original is not suitable.

The second is to source a smaller, possibly desk-mounted projector for short-term use, this would have the advantage of being far cheaper and simple to use and would not require mounting on the ceiling. These can be sourced from other locations such as Amazon for desk mounted from approximately £60 onwards. A good quality one from Currys has been sourced at £105, with others at £90-181.

The greatest issue with cheaper projectors is that they may fail within a shorter amount of time, although only used occasionally outside of the once-a-month meeting for the Planning Committee this could be a very real problem in the future.

The third is to continue to use the council owned television that is currently in place at No 8, this screen is smaller but visible and is sufficient to display directly from a laptop. This will not require any costs outside of the standard electricity supply that is used, an amount that is likely to be less than either of the other choices.

Use of the television also means less likelihood of failure than the mini projectors, as well as the ability to move it when and where necessary for meetings. The television is also already owned by the council and so will cost nothing in outlay.


It is also necessary to mention that the purchase of a projector may depend on the council's position considering No 8 The Strand in the future, if it is no longer use by the council as a meeting place then any projector bought for the short term may be put into storage for the foreseeable future. This is also likely if the Planning Committee returns to Elizabeth House for meetings due to the projector already in position there.






