Notes from the meeting held on Tuesday 27th July 2021

The meeting was held in Sutton Community Centre and was attended by four members of the public

Visitors - A local resident voiced concerns about the amount of dog waste bags left on the footpaths, particularly on the footpath over to The Brooms. It was decided that notices should be put on the Sutton Facebook page and in the notice boards.

A local resident suggested the notice board at the Church Hall should be relocated to make it easier to read. The Councillors considered this. Various queries arose including whether the notice board is still necessary and would a new one need planning permission. To be discussed again at the September meeting.

Planning - The Councillors considered four planning applications including the change of use of land north of Eastling Down Farm Cottages to a Traveller site and the application at East Studdal Nurseries for the erection of 14 dwellings. The planning log is up and running on the website for parishioners to check local applications.

The Council also briefly discussed the consultation on the parish settlement confines. To be further discussed at the September meeting.

Playing field - An update was given on the current Public Spaces Protection Order which has been extended for one year as DDC has been unable to carry out a consultation. The existing one still shows a dog exclusion zone in the old play area. DDC hope to send the consultation out in the autumn which the parish council will respond to.

Orchard Community Event - The date for Apple day was fixed for Saturday 18th September 2021. A specific risk assessment for the event to include the bee hives and any up to date government guidelines will be agreed at the September meeting.

Correspondence - The Councillors agreed on their response to the Community Resilience/Emergency Plan Questionnaire and also agreed for details of the Litter petition to go on the website and notice boards.

The next ordinary meeting is on Tuesday 7th September 2021 at 7.30pmSutton Parish Community Centre

AWARD SCHEME

Highlights from the Meeting of Walmer Parish Council held on Wednesday, 7th July 2021 at Deal Parochial C of E School, Walmer.

Cllr Bond gave a report on DDC and KCC matters as follows: - He had contacted the police commissioner regarding speeding problems in Walmer.

Although an Alcohol licence for the paddling pool and minigolf course had been granted if there were Anti-Social Behaviour issues that licence could be reviewed.

Crime and anti-social behaviour reports: - PCSO Herod gave a report on items of interest since the last report.

The local police had confiscated quantities of alcohol and cannabis in the last month.

A community speed watch campaign was active in the Parish (new Dover Road) and surrounding localities.

Underage drinking in the Parish had been addressed in the last month. £100's of beer and spirits were seized and destroyed by the police, before the very eyes of the underage drinkers.

Events Working Group: - Members were invited to volunteer to help during the day at the first post lockdown Brocante which is being held on Bank Holiday Monday 30th August. Cllr Beard-Gould reported that volunteers too were needed help marshal the event which was sold out.

A review will be held after the event to decide whether or not to return to the May Bank Holiday date or continue to hold the event in August.

Climate Emergency Working Group: - The purchase of a thermal imaging camera to assist Walmer residents with home heating efficiency issues was proposed but deferred until the September council meeting, where a full report will be submitted by the Working group.

Financial Report: - Members approved a series of recommendations from the Finance and General Purposes Committee to re-organise and consolidate the Council's bank accounts. They agreed to close three bank accounts and transfer the funds into organisations specialising in ethical banking.

They also decided that in the event of replacement accounts or safe deposits not being available in time the process will be suspended until alternatives are agreed.

Proposal for Borrow Pit car park: - Cllr M Eddy proposed that an application for improved signs to the Borrow pit car park from the DDC 'Welcome back fund' be applied for. Following the outcome of this proposal, further proposals may be made.

Adaptation/refurbishment of new Council Offices: - Estimates were received and approved for work from building contractors and members resolved that the estimates received from RJW Building Contractors Ltd be approved and that this company be engaged to carry out the work.

Telecoms estimates received and approved VOIP phones and Wi-Fi installations. Members resolved that the estimates received from Mitec Group Ltd were approved and that Mitec Group Ltd be engaged to carry out the work.

Selection of removal contractors: - Members authorised the Clerk to seek three estimates for the removal of council items from 8, the Strand to 62, the Strand, and to engage with the removal firm with the most competitive estimate.

Dear Residents,

We hope that you have all enjoyed the summer season although, sadly, the latter part did not provide much in the way of good weather.

Dover District Council continues to work hard and has extended its use of virtual technology so that now all committee meetings have resumed and can be viewed by members of the public. The first ever virtual council meeting was the Annual Council Meeting and took place on 22nd July.

Speedwatch volunteers went back to work on 15th June with teams within the District resuming their activities. The Winter Round of Community Grants remains up and running and the date for applications has been extended to 20th September. To date DDC have received 41 applications totalling £67,987.

On behalf of DDC we would like to apologise for the inconvenience you all experienced as consequence of Veolia's failure to provide an efficient service since May. Work to resolve the rescheduling issues will still take a few weeks to complete and it is anticipated that revised routes are unlikely to be in place before October. Collection services were severely affected by a national shortage of HGV drivers and by the so called 'pingdemic' requiring staff to self-isolate. DDC are doing all they can to maintain services, but this was proving increasingly difficult for Veolia given their current staffing levels. DDC therefore agreed to their request to suspend garden waste collections, to provide them with some additional capacity to support the recycling collection services. They are in daily discussion with Veolia regarding resource levels to determine when the full range of services can be resumed. At this stage, the message to those affected residents is that they should store their garden waste until their next scheduled collection. They are looking at arrangements to compensate customers by measures such as extending the subscription period or offering a rebate off next year's renewal. The position is now improving fast. Latest daily reports show that 100% of household, recyclable and garden waste collections are taking place on the scheduled dates.

Closer to home concerns remain about the influx of visitors camping along Undercliffe Rd. There were also complaints about the increase in dog fouling on the beach and the continuing closure of the public toilets. The toilets were reopened on 5th June. DDC environmental enforcement have increased their patrols within the area and placed a number of dog fouling warning notices in the vicinity. DDC will be taking part in the Great British Beach Clean which will be run from 17th September 2021 to 25th September 2021 and a beach cleaning event is being planned for Thursday 23rd September 2021 between 10am and 11am at Kingsdown Beach (at the end of Undercliffe Road, Kingsdown). DDC will be providing further information on this event shortly.

Finally, we both wish you a pleasant autumn and please do contact us if you have any concerns that you would like us to help you with.

Now, Free Moving Traffic....

A proposal from Walmer Parish Council to relieve congestion and excessive exhaust fumes on Station Rd in Walmer has been successfully completed..

• Now traffic can move freely in both directions simultaneously instead of having to queue while waiting for vehicles to pass between two lines of parked cars, no queuing means:

No exhaust fumes being pumped from

static cars into pedestrians or nearby houses.

- Buses being able to move freely improving journey times.
- No traffic jams at rush hour stretching back into Dover Rd.
- Improved journey times for all motorists, vans and lorries.

The plan was initiated by Walmer Parish Council after Dover District Council decided to grant planning permission for another large housing estate at the bottom end of Dover Rd and the Council sought ways to mitigate the increased traffic from this development and also the

The background - Approximately 100 yards from the junction with Dover Rd the double yellow lines ended with the result that vehicles parked on both sides of the road caused bottlenecks back to Dover Rd affecting traffic moving along Dover Rd towards Deal. Simultaneously, because there is only room for one vehicle at a time to pass between the parked cars traffic also built up in the opposite direction.

The result was often frustration for drivers, delays and a reduction in the flow of traffic entering Station Road from Dover Road which could have the effect of causing tailbacks there too.

Ironically the cause of these problems was a small gap of around 20 yards in the yellow lines painted on the road on the southern side of Station Road, with space for only two or three cars to park.

Kent County Council have a list of traffic improvement projects which Councils like Walmer can ask for specific projects to be added by means of the Highway Improvement Plan (HIP) process. Such projects are normally funded by the Council which asks for them to be carried out.

Chairman of Walmer Parish Council, James Murray, said:" Because of the massive

increase in traffic from these two housing developments we felt that losing just two or three parking places along Station Rd which would enable traffic to move freely in both directions was something which would benefit not just those living near the site and possibly suffering from excessive exhaust fumes from cars in traffic jams but also those people using Station Rd to access home or work.

"The Highways Authority agreed with us and the project was fast tracked and is now in place."
