



Council Tax News

During term time, Glen Road and The Rise and The Avenue between 1st March and 31st October all suffer from a huge influx of uncoordinated traffic from outside the village all heading to or from a specific destination.

Until 2005, the International campsite was a scout camp when it was sold for £1.1million. The sale included Butterlease, the single storey bungalow with PP for use as indoor accommodation for the camp site. Butterlease has been extended into the roof space and refurbished for occupation by two of the owners. Now 260m2 in size but rated Band E because of the traffic. Yet dwellings in The Avenue have received no band reduction for the same traffic.

The Valuation Office argue that an increase in traffic and associated pollution and noise nuisance is not a reason for reducing the band UNLESS the traffic is destined for a newly opened or enlarged venue, which description must include the International camp site and the Kingsdown Primary School

The school has expanded since April 1993 when 150 children from the parish were taught in 5 classes of 30 children. By 1998 the school had expanded to 190 children in 7 classes taught in a new building plus 2 mobile classrooms. The Parish Council reported their concerns at the additional traffic being generated by the numbers of children attending the school from outside the parish and the inherent dangers to all the children travelling to and from the school.

In 2000 the school joined the Deal learning Alliance, and the number of children from outside the parish quickly exceeded 50% of the entire school, causing the character of Glen Road to become a rat-run to and from the school.

In 2005 the passing place and pavements were constructed as a condition of the PP for 4 new build dormer bungalows in Glen Rd.

By 2012 there were 209 children on the roll of which only 84 were from the parish and 125 from Deal, Walmer and the surrounding villages, increasing the number of cars driving too and from the school twice a day during term time.

The physical locality of the area changed in 2006, 2009 and 2019 when extensions and new buildings were constructed at the school. The school travel plan of 2019 showed the percentage of the 125 children being driven to Kingsdown, parking the car at the school or in the roads nearby and walking to school. PLUS 26 teachers travel in to school by car.

The character of the school changed again on 1st January 2021 when the school became an academy school and full member of the Deal Education Alliance for Learning Trust" with 217 children on the roll, without the possibility of KCC improving the infrastructure to the school.

Residents of the Avenue, Glen Road and The Rise can make a proposal at any time for a band reduction based upon a belief that the changes in the physical locality caused by the expansion of the school or change in character of the camp site has caused the value of your homes to be reduced.



In aid of Ovarian cancer

I decided to take on the challenge of walking Hadrian's Wall. My two friends, Charlie (in red) and Helen (in blue), very kindly offered to accompany me. Like Hadrian in planning his wall, the three of us took a long time in planning our walk. We faced many disruptions, not least was Covid.

On 14th May 2022 we eventually met at Bowness on Solway, a tiny village in northwest Cumbria and on the morning of the 15th we started the first leg of our journey. We carried all our luggage on our backs throughout the journey.

The wall is Britain's largest archaeological feature. Today you can only see around 10% of the original structure. During the walk we did a detour to Lanercost Priory. This beautiful and tranquil setting belies its troubled history. Standing close to Hadrian's Wall it suffered frequent attacks during the long Anglo-Scottish wars.

So how long is the wall? A Roman unit of distance was the 'Mille passum' which translates to a thousand paces. A Roman mile measured five thousand feet. This would have made the wall eight miles long; however in modern measurement the wall is 73 miles long.

On the 21st May we walked the final five miles to Wallsend where our journey ended. We had stayed in a variety of accommodation ranging from a very comfortable camping pod to a bunkhouse. It had taken us seven and a half days to achieve our goal. The adrenalin rush lasted several more days!

We then took the Metro to Newcastle train station where we parted as truly bonded friends. I hope my story inspires others to take on challenges.

By the way, this year commemorates the 1900 year's anniversary of Hadrian's Wall.

FOR THE LOVE OF HORSES!

As you drive down Glen Road towards Walmer you may have noticed the horses in the field on the right. The horses are Irish Cobs and they belong to Jan, Pat and Jeannie. They've kept horses since 1995 when first they met. They told me that it's a full time commitment and you need to attend to them every day, including Christmas day. It's a huge undertaking, but it is well worth the effort.

Horses require approximately an acre of land per horse. Apart from grass horses eat most vegetables and apples, they have hay in winter and also pellets which are given as a supplement – they also love mints and carrots as a treat. It's important that passers-by should not be tempted to feed the horses as it can be bad for their digestion and can cause jealousy between them.

Jack, Charlie and Lennie require regular exercise, weather permitting. They are shoeless horses which makes them very sure footed, even so they still need to see a Farrier every six to eight weeks to trim their hooves.

Jack (Brown) 15.3 hands high and is 16 year's old Charlie (White) 15.1 and 16 year's old Lennie (Mixed) 14.00 and 13 year's old

Joey is the horse on the right that has been rescued, he is five year's old. In the past he has been badly treated which has left him disabled. Some days he suffers more than others, but with the love and care that he receives now – his life is pretty good. He is very gentle and requires a lot of TLC needless to say he gets this in abundance.


I had never been close to a horse before, let alone groomed one. I was privileged to spend a morning with Jan and Pat. They showed me how to groom Joey and make a fuss of him. I must admit I was smitten!

Jan and Pat told me that since the high winds in winter a lot of the bridleways have been inaccessible. Freedown Woods, in particular, it is virtually impossible to take the horses through due to fallen trees.

Unfortunately, exercising the horses on the roads can be difficult as a minority of motorists are not patient. Pat explained that they need to have a camera on their helmets because of abusive motorists. Fortunately, most people are considerate and understand that patience and a wide berth needs to be given when passing horses on the narrow lanes.

Jack, Charlie and Lennie enjoy paddling in the sea and they also enjoy being groomed.

Not to miss out on the limelight Nancy the dog decided to have a dip in the horses' water bath.



Jan and Pat would recommend anyone considering getting a horse to be in the know about horses. They also suggested sharing the responsibility with another person - that way you can at least take a holiday.

I asked them why horses, and collectively they replied,

"They give you so much back and they are good for the soul!"

Summer Recipe Quick & Easy Paella

- 1 tbsp olive oil
- 2 chicken breasts fillets, cut into chunks
- 2 small onions, finely sliced
- 1 fat garlic clove, crushed
- 140g cooking chorizo, sliced
- 1 tsp turmeric
- pinch of saffron
- 1 tsp paprika
- 300g paella rice
- 850ml hot chicken or vegetable stock
- 200g frozen peas
- 1 lemon, cut into wedges, to serve
- ½ small bunch of parsley, finely chopped, to serve

Method

- Heat the olive oil in a deep frying pan over a high heat. Brown the chicken all over don't cook completely. Once browned, transfer to a plate.
- Reduce the heat to low, add the onions and cook slowly until softened, about 10 mins. Add the garlic, stir for 1 min, then toss in the chorizo and fry until it releases its oils.
- Stir in the spices, then tip in the rice. Stir to coat the rice in the oils and spices for about 2 mins, then pour in the stock. Bring to the boil, return the chicken to the pan and simmer for about 20 mins, stirring occasionally.
- Add the peas to the pan and simmer for a further 5 mins until the rice is cooked and the chicken is tender. Season well and serve with the lemon and parsley.






