

UPDATE FROM THE TREASURERS

In the November edition of Rural Roundup, we promised to bring you up to date with our negotiations with both Ringwould-with-Kingsdown Parish Council and Walmer Town Council. Our intention was, hopefully, to enlist support from both Councils, as in the past, with help in meeting the cost of printing our magazine.

Our discussions with Walmer Town Council are still ongoing. However, Ringwould-with-Kingsdown Parish Council are no longer going to support us. They have reneged on the promise that they made to us in writing at the beginning of lockdown in which the Council had agreed to resume payment of support to Rural Roundup when we recommenced distribution of printed editions of our magazine.

This means that we now have a shortfall in our budget. If we are to continue production of hard copies of Rural Roundup, we shall be obliged to reduce the number of editions to six each year as opposed to ten.





Kingsdown Conservation Group Campaigning for our village

Hello all.

On Wednesday 16 November we had our AGM at The Kings Head. It was very well supported by over 35 members. The restrictions of Covid meant we were not able to hold an AGM since 2019, so the three annual reports were available to read. A headline report of our activities was described. The committee now consisted of Anne Marie Martin, Alison Sharvill, Debbie Muggoch, Sue Lamoon, Ian Williams, Helen Williams and a new member Jeremy Clarke.

The main concern of members is the new DOVER DISTRICT LOCAL PLAN. The local plan is now out for its final public consultation. This document will form the basis for all planning decisions for the next ten years so it needs to be good. You have until 9 December to comment.

In order for comments to be considered it must be submitted using the representation form, answering the specific questions set out within it. If it is not submitted in this way, your comment may not be accepted due to the legal requirements at this stage of the Plan making process.



The Curling's of Kingsdown by Jenny Wall

would like to introduce you to Mr and Mrs William Curling. This couple lie at the heart of the development of modern day Kingsdown from a small fishing, agricultural and seafaring hamlet to a modern village complete with a country house, church and first village school. The couple came to Kingsdown in the early 1820's, bought extensive land and proceeded to live in the area for some 35 years.

Mr William Curling who was born on 5th August 1773 (to distinguish him from the many other William Curlings) owned extensive land including, by the early 1820's some 85 acres in and around Kingsdown village. The first known record of him in the area is dated 1816 when he rented 14 Dolphin Street Deal on a 21-year lease.

After building Kingsdown house William Curling went on to commission the building of the schoolhouse (now our village hall) and then later the church, all built over a period of some 30 years.

William married Elisabeth Green in 1827 and one is left to speculate that together they designed Kingsdown House which they owned until after William died in 1855. It is highly likely that the house was built as their country retreat (on the first floor there was a trunk room); their primary residences continued to be in Church Row Limehouse and Hamilton House West Grove, Royal Greenwich London.

19th century 1841 tithe map of Kingsdown shows a small chapel. Recorded in East Kent Parishes 2nd Edition by David Wright (2002) as a Methodist chapel dated 1813. The building lies in the back garden of Wayside Cottage on Upper Street. 

So why did the Curling's come to Kingsdown? As wealthy Victorians, enjoying highly successful businesses across a range of interests from ship building, ship insurance, rope making, trade in whale fins and other "commodities" such as sugar and the transportation of slaves, philanthropy was expected.

It was a time of rapid change, the midst of the industrial revolution, a time when such things as social justice, the spirit of reform, improving people's lives, particularly that of children, came to the forefront of modern thinking.

By the 1840s William was the Squire of the hamlet of Kingsdown, it is reported that he said "the beer house should not be the only open door in Kingsdown". Certainly, it's also possible to state that visiting the seaside had been made fashionable by King George IV and during the regency period in general. William Curling was on "visiting terms" with his neighbour the Duke of Wellington and was on a guest list dining with the Duke, Queen Victoria, and Prince Albert at Walmer Castle in 1842.

It was during this time that it was reported in the Dover Express and East Kent News that Queen Victoria and Prince Albert had sheltered from the rain in a fishermen's hut on the beach at Kingsdown that belonged to Thomas Erridge. Later the article recalls the fisherman received a lifelong pension for his kindness.

After William's death the house was sold to a Mr T S Clarke J. P. Deputy Lieutenant of Surrey. Two of this gentleman's daughters are remembered, as are seven members of the Curling family, on stained glass windows in St John's Church. A year after William died, Elizabeth accompanied by her servants left Kingsdown and spent the rest of her life in Eastbourne.

Since 1934 Kingsdown house has been part of a holiday camp, a WW2 training camp, a Union club, a restaurant, and a night club, before being divided and sold as four separate residences.

In Evelyn Waugh's book 'Men at Arms' the first part of his 'Sword of Honour' trilogy, he uses Kingsdown House (where he was based for a few weeks in 1940 while training with the Royal Marines) as the fictious Kut-al-Imara House.

In 1940 Waugh described Kingsdown House as follows:

"Kingsdown is lousy. It is a hideous, derelict Victorian villa without carpets, curtains or furniture, one bath, one WC without a seat and another without a plug. Surrounding is a collection of huts built of one thickness of asbestos for use in the summer as a holiday camp. The cold is intense".

A further local association with Evelyn Waugh is to be found at Walmer Castle. From 1913 – 1934 Lord Beauchamp was Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports. It is widely believed that Evelyn Waugh's Flyte family of Brideshead Revisited fame, were inspired by the Beauchamp family during their eventful years residing at Walmer Castle


Not having the figures to hand, Mr. Mannion has agreed to produce them in time for the December PC meeting.

Once this cost is available, RWKPC has agreed to calculate the additional precept to the parish rate that would make good this deficit, with a view to re-introducing the more regular bus service. Perhaps in conjunction with the parishes of both Deal and Walmer as the service was of benefit to all, linking all three communities and their respective amenities.

The above should be able to be confirmed by reference to the minutes of the RWKPC meeting of November 2022

The Ripple group runs regular speedwatch sessions and more local residents have joined us as volunteers - many thanks to them. Speeding remains an issue - a recent morning session found that around 25% of cars entering Ripple were speeding with a top speed of 47mph recorded.

Highway Improvement Plan

Councillors are pleased to report that work is expected to start by the end of the year on the next stage of our traffic calming measures. By moving the 30mph speed restriction further out toward Crooked 'S' and installing new signage on the approach to the crossroads at Pommeus Lane and Mongeham Road, drivers will be aware of the speed restrictions further outside the village boundary, hopefully slowing traffic through the village. The work has been part-funded by a Member's Grant and the Chairman thanks Cllr Steve Manion for his support and helping the parish council achieve this outcome.

It is long overdue, but thank-you to Cllr Muir and the many volunteers who gave up a few hours on a Sunday morning back in the summer and collected a massive 20 sacks of litter, including an exhaust, a tyre and a broken bedside cabinet!

Parish Council Meeting

November's meeting was very well attended with a lot of interest in the application for outline planning permission to build 9 houses on land behind Chapel and Church Lanes. The Parish Council heard strong arguments from attendees against the development and agreed to raise objections with DDC. Other items discussed included: setting up a Community Interest Company (a company that operates to benefit its local community); creating a Neighbourhood Development Plan for Ripple; and the Dover District Draft Plan. The Neighbourhood Watch (NHW) co-ordinator hopes to start a monthly meeting in the village for residents to discuss any crime related worries and consider ways that safety in the village can be improved. The planned start date is April 2023.



Kingsdown Village - Jane Banks & Sharon Morris

Second of three part history - continued from November edition

The Curlings built their home, Kingsdown House (now the Manor House), and afterwards financed the building of the original Victorian School in 1843 (now the Village Hall). The school had two large rooms with a fireplace in each room – you can still see the evidence in the pattern of the floorboards in the main hall. The lower hall was the cloakroom. Elizabeth Curling ran the Sunday school.

The School Deed was found on a small handwritten note in VH records and is very different to today's standards!!

- 1. The school may only be used as a school
- 2. The committee to be Incumbent plus 5 others who must subscribe £1 per annum to school funds
- 3. The only people entitled to elect a member of the committee shall be a contributor of 10/- per annum to the school
- 4. Mistress of school with a member of C (committee? / C of E?)
- 5. The committee may dismiss the teacher
- 6. Each April a committee of 4 ladies can be....?
- 7. The school is only for the children 'of labouring, manufacturing, or poorer classes'
- 8. The Trustees of the school are the Vicar, and Churchwardens

Lawrence Kirkman, the schoolmaster in February 1859, was reported in the local press as being 'up before magistrates' as he had caned a pupil on the back of a hand and the back of his head.

Monday. Lawrence Kirkman, schoolmaster, of Kingsdown, was charged with assaulting George Cole, a lad about

13 years of age, and a scholar in the school.

George Cole, on being sworn, said-I was at the Kingsdown school on the 8th of February. My master, Mr. Kirkman, called me from my class and asked me to hold out my hand, which I refused to do; he then took hold of it by force and cut me across the back of the hand with the cape, and afterwards across my head. I told him that my father said that was not a proper place to strike me, and then left the school and went home.

The magistrates, after a few minutes' deliberation, dismissed the case, admonishing Mr. Kirkman to be more careful in future as to how he inflicted punishment; this being the second time he had appeared before them under similar circumstances, and recommended him in future wherever punishment was necessary, to take the advice of the clergyman, the Rev. Mr. Charlton, before inflicting it.

GREENFIELD DEVELOPMENTS IN KINGSDOWN?

Many in Kingsdown are deeply concerned about the dangers if / when a housing development were constructed on Ringwould road or on Glen Road or near Courtlands. Many want to respond to DDC and protest about SAP 34 and SAP 35 included in the DDC Local Plan now out for consultation. BUT RESPONDING isn't easy!

KCG at their AGM on Wed 16 agreed to lay on a help session, workshop-style for residents on afternoon of Sun 4th Dec because the deadline of the consultation is 5pm on Fri 9th December 2022. Those wishing for help should bring along their laptops and ask for advice. There will also be paper DDC Representation Forms that can be completed.

Residents attended the parish council meeting on 14th Nov, the day that a sad fatality on the A258 caused the A road to be closed and traffic to be diverted down narrow Kingsdown streets without pavements between daylight hours of 2pm until well after dark past 7.30pm. Pedestrians report near-misses!

Residents were pleased to hear the PC is planning to assist residents also with a special PC meeting on this issue very soon (watch noticeboards and website). A KCC cllr who also sits on DDC attend the PC meeting and he was told how very sick citizens are of their voices of opposition to greenfield developments (and the opposition of their parish councils) not being heeded by higher level councils.

The evidence we can check includes this <u>Appendix 3b HELAA 2020 Housing Sites</u> <u>Highways Assessment (doverdistrictlocalplan.co.uk)</u> and SAP 34 Woodhill Farm Ringwould Rd is at the top of page 9 in the highways assessment. If we disagree on the 'evidence' of this assessment - we should say so IMHO.

This link shows the new adjacent Courtlands SAP 35 Appendix 2d TC4S Housing Sites Highways Assessment (doverdistrictlocalplan.co.uk) in this I can see they assessed the SAP35 adjacent Courtlands bottom of page 4

A third site for 70 houses, at the bottom of Glen Road in Walmer is SAP 15 on page 127 of the Reg 19 Doc. A fourth site for 15 houses, is on Dover Rd Ringwould SAP 53 on page 195.

Any of these developments is very likely to dramatically reduce road safety, as well as removing the farmland we need for food security, and if any combination of them were built, mayhem would ensue IMHO.
