2. Promenade Cycleway

Details of issue

Located around Hut 55 and the paddling pool. Where busy dogs and children run in to cycle lane making this dangerous to cyclists and pedestrians. People are required to cross to visit the scout hut and hut 55. Visibility is somewhat limited from both sides due to walls and hedges as well as the huts.

Information from KCC or requirements

Options are to have increased signage warning both pedestrians and cyclist of the need to be aware of each other or to have a cyclists dismount signage. Signage on the Sustrans is enforceable although rarely is it. This makes dismounting signage an issue for the disabled with a cycle, as bikes are not currently recognised as a mobility aid meaning that they are also required to dismount whether they are able or not. The Department of Transport does not support the creation new of cycle routes where dismounting is required however on existing routes the guidance is that "it should only be used where it would be unsafe or impracticable for a cyclist to continue, or at the end of a route. It should be borne in mind that some people with mobility impairments will be unable to dismount." (cycle infrastructure design guide 13.4).

Details of issue

Flooding in near to the old St Marys in the street. Picked up from Facebook, picture below shows effects of heavy rain during the months of May-July this happened on three occasions according to the post. One resident suggested that increasing the height of the road at the junction with Dover Road would alleviate the issue as the water runs down from Dover road and following the path of least resistance in to Church Street.

Information from KCC or requirements

KCC are responsible for investigating areas of flooding. The legislation is section 19 of Flood and Water Management act 2010. Which requires that KCC on becoming aware of a flood in its area, a lead local flood authority must, to the extent that it considers it necessary or appropriate, investigate—
(a) which risk management authorities have relevant flood risk management functions, and
(b) whether each of those risk management authorities has exercised, or is proposing to exercise, those functions in response to the flood.

Where an authority carries out an investigation under subsection (1) it must—
(a)publish the results of its investigation, and
(b)notify any relevant risk management authorities

Item: Dropped kerbs. Date: 17/09/25.

As part of the work we carried out with the Speaking Up Group Walmer Town Council carried out looking at accessible road crossings, one of the routes identified was along The Beach/Kingsdown Road from the Lifeboat station to Borrow Pit car park.


Kent County Council have now complete the design work for adding 4 pairs of dropped kerbs, one on Granville Road, one on Alexandra Road, one on Cambridge Road and an additional dropped kerb on Kingsdown Road. This will provide a full route from the start of The Beach to Granville Road on the landside of the road at which point the path terminates.


The total cost of the project would be £9074.01 and Kent County Council have offered to fund £2074.01 meaning Walmer Town Council to proceed would need to fund £7000.00 toward the project.


The reserves hold £8000 towards highways Improvements and a further £8000 is held in this years budget against highways improvement items. The project at Meadowside on Liverpool Road to add signage to increase awareness of pedestrians in the road was funded by KCC. The two other projects taken to KCC, are a scheme to provide dropped kerbs along Dover Road, this is awaiting a completed plan from KCC's active travel as there is cross over between what we are proposing and the KCC plan. The second project is the cycle way connecting the Skylark Trail to Sustrans 1 this is awaiting DDC's Walking and Cycling Plan as again there are cross overs.

As the total is over £2000 a recommendation will need to be made to Full Council to confirm the amount to be spent.

Item: No engine idling stickers.

Date: 09/09/25.

Meeting: September Amenities and Environment.

From: Climate Emergency Working Group.

At the 11th June 2025 Climate Emergency Working Group meeting members expressed an interest in taking low-cost action in regard to engine idling at traffic works. In the meeting of the CEWG committee on the 5th August 2025 it was agreed to recommend to the Amenities and Environment Committee to spend no more than £55 (including VAT) on 10 sticker 40cm x 30Cm to back on card saying "No Engine Idling". Thes stickers would be placed in areas of where traffic often comes to a stop.



The RAC states "Idling, instead of turning your engine off while stationary, increases the amount of exhaust emissions in the air.

These emissions contain a number of harmful gasses including carbon dioxide, which is bad for the environment and contributes towards climate change, as well as a range of other harmful gasses including nitrogen dioxide, carbon monoxide and hydrocarbons which are linked to asthma and other lung diseases." Leaving an engine idling unnecessarily is illegal under rule 123 of the highway code but can only be enforced if the motorist refuses to turn off the engine after being asked to do so by an authorised person.

The recommendation of the Climate Emergency Working Group is to spend up to £55 on stickers to be placed as required near traffic stopping areas.

Item: Beebombs. Date: 16/09/25.

The Climate Emergency Working Group recommends the purchase of 100 Beebombs initially with potential to purchase to be distributed to interested residents. The wholesale price per Beebomb is £2.81 per unit making a total of £281.00. The money not spent will be used to purchase up to 48 Beebombs at a later date.

Currently held in a reserve from last year we have £425.00 allocated towards the purchase of Beebombs.

Via social media, Our website we would advertise to the residents of Walmer the opportunity to claim their free Beebomb.

The Beebombs selected are the same as the ones we have previously and successfully offered to residents with a take up of more than 100.

The proposal is to initially purchase 100 Beebombs and delegate responsibility to the officers to purchase the additional 48 if required. Total cost would be £423.56.

Item: Door Replacement Report


The Climate Emergency Working Group has been looking into improving the council offices heat loss efficiency, one of these improvements is the replacement of the front door of the offices. Originally the replacement of the front door was part of a planning application forwarded to Dover District Council in 2022, in order to prevent the loss of the planning permission already granted, at least one modification based on the application is required.

In the replacement of the door, both of these conditions will be met. Currently the front door of the building has had constant exposure to the elements. Also due to the age of the door, the current one may no longer be suitable under government guidelines.

I have also looked into reasons to replace an older front door, the following are those reasons.

- Double Glazing ceases to function fully due to loss of vacuum between the panes.
- Rubber/plastic seals corrode and petrify causing gaps to appear in said seals
- Constant exposure to the elements can cause damage to the plastic façade.
- Warping of the door from exposure and use can lead to small gaps, this can lead to increased heat loss.

Year on year changes (detailed below)

At this stage the Committee can only make a recommendation to Finance and General purposes to accept a budget. Finance and General purposes will make a final recommendation to Full Council where the full budget must be agreed.

Allotments

Increase in cost of utilities to cover off any potential large jump in water prices.

Land Management

Drill field access road -to include lighting costs being discussed at council and for some remedial work that will be required on road in the near future.

MUGA – reduced to £0 as no safety inspection or locking required.

Projects and Activities

DDC toilets – Likely to see increases as contract term expires a short term extension is being sought.

Publicity and promotion

Reduced to allow for £2000 to be in reserve to replace one noticeboard should it become necessary, noticeboards are 20 years old.

Stony Path

Stony path – reduced budget move 23/24 to reserves if not spent to allow £16,000 for project to be put in place. £2000 for maintenance.

Tree planting

No changes but recommend amending the budget to a planting budget so wildflowers can be considered under this budget.

CEWG budget

Beebombs – No budget this year due to having a reserve from previous year recommended Budget £450.

Seawater testing kits – small increase of £40 due to inflation.

Walmer against plastic – stickers purchased no required budget for 2026/27

Tree purchase – new item purchase of up to 50 native saplings for distribution to the public for up to the value of £550.
